Two University of Texas (UT) institutions collaborating to provide a unique opportunity to learn about management and public health. Following the curriculum below, students will earn a Master of Business Administration (MBA) degree from the University of Texas Permian Basin (UTPB) and a Master of Public Health (MPH) from UTHealth Houston School of Public Health. The dual nature of this program reduces the time and credit hours required if pursued independently.
