American Academy of Arts and Sciences	Hellman Fellow for Science, Engineering, and Technology	\$70,000 - \$75,000, plus a full benefits package	February	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must have a Ph.D. in an area of science or engineering and have some experience or a demonstrated interest in an area related to science and technology policy. • Must be eligible to work in the U.S. without Academy sponsorship. • 2-year term, starting September • Remote role with occasional travel to the Academy's headquarters in Cambridge, MA, or other locations for events.
Open Society Foundation	Open Society Fellowship	\$80,000 - \$100,000, plus project expenses	February	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supports individuals pursuing innovative and unconventional approaches to fundamental open society challenges. • 1-year term, requests for shorter or longer durations may be considered. • A portion of the fellowship term will be at one of the offices in NY, WA, London, Brussels, Budapest, or at a regional foundation.
National Endowment for the Arts	Creative Writing Fellowships	\$25,000	March	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prose and poetry grants alternate years. • May submit only 1 application per year. • Must meet recent publication criteria. • No residency requirement.

Paris Institute for Advanced Study	Fellowship Programs	Varies; Housing and travel to Paris is provided	March	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The primary mission of the Paris IAS is to be a research center anchored in the humanities and social sciences, open to any discipline and subject within this domain. It aims to enable a fruitful dialogue between researchers from different cultural and disciplinary backgrounds. The majority of fellowships are open to any discipline/subject within the humanities and social sciences. • Paris residency for 5-9 months during the academic year. • No citizenship requirements; applicants who have spent more than 12 months of the last 3 years in France are not eligible.
National Endowment for the Humanities	NEH Fellowships	Max \$60,000 (\$5,000/month)	April	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Time to conduct research or to produce books, monographs, peer-reviewed articles, e-books, digital materials, translations with annotations or a critical apparatus, or critical editions resulting from previous research. • 6- to 12-month term. • No residency requirement.
National Endowment for the Humanities	NEH Fellowships for Digital Publication	\$5,000/month	April	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support interpretive research projects that require digital expression and digital publication. Stand-alone documentaries and podcasts are not allowed. • 6- to 12-month term. • No residency requirement.
Council for International Exchange for Scholars	Fullbright Scholar Program	Varies	August	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teaching and/or research grants to scholars in all fields to spend two 12 months overseas. • Must be a U.S. citizen. • Ph.D. or equivalent required • Foreign language proficiency is required in some but not all programs.
American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS)	ACLS Fellowship Program	\$60,000, plus \$7,500 for costs incurred during the research term	September	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support scholars in all disciplines of the humanities and interpretive social sciences. • 12-month term; awards for shorter duration will be prorated at \$5,000/month with the min at \$30,000 • Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. • Ph.D. required. • Not hold a tenured faculty position.

Guggenheim Foundation	Guggenheim Fellowship	Varies	September	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mid-career awards for scholars who have already demonstrated exceptional capacity for productive scholarship in any field or exceptional creative ability in the arts. • 6- to 12-month term. • Former Guggenheim Fellows are not eligible to apply for another award.
Harvard University	Radcliffe Fellowship	\$78,000, plus \$5,000 to cover project expenses	September for humanities, social sciences, and creative arts. October for science, engineering, and mathematics.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support scholars and artists proposing innovative work that confronts pressing social and policy issues and seeks to engage audiences beyond academia. • Start September – May • No citizenship requirement. • Past applicants must submit a new application.
New York Public Library	Cullman Center Fellowship	Up to \$85,000, plus an office with a computer and full access to the library's physical and electronic resources	September	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support people whose work will benefit directly from access to the research collections at the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building at Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street. • 9-month term (September – May) • Must work at the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building during fellowship. • No citizenship requirement.
Council on Foreign Relations	International Affairs Fellowship	\$120,000	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offer fellows the chance to experience a new environment and gain a different perspective at a pivotal moment in their careers. Academics are placed in public service and policy-oriented settings. • Must be U.S. citizens, mid-career professionals, strong record of professional achievement and a firm grounding in the field of foreign policy, and hold at least a bachelor's degree or equivalent. • 12-month term.

Institute for Advanced Study	School of Historical Studies	Up to \$78,000 for the AY Up to \$39,000 for 1 term	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support scholarship in all fields of historical research, but is concerned principally with the history of western, near eastern, and Asian civilizations, with particular emphasis upon the Greek and Roman world, the history of Europe (medieval, early modern, and modern), the Islamic world, East Asian studies, art history, history of science, and late modern history. • Members in the School or appointed for either term (first term September 25 – December 22, second term January 15 – April 12), or for 2 terms, amounting to a full AY. • Must have a Ph.D. and have at least 3 substantial articles in print in scholarly publications. • Must be in residence in Princeton during the fellowship term.
Institute for Advanced Study	School of Social Science Fellowships	Up to \$78,000	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support scholars working on a variety of topics to pursue their individual research within a rich context of intellectual discussion and exchange. • AY term (September – May) • Must hold a Ph.D. or equivalent. • Must be in residence. • No citizenship requirements.
National Humanities Center	National Humanities Center Fellowship	Varies depends on the Fellow's needs and the Center's ability to meet them	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support research in all fields of humanities. Scholars in the natural and social sciences, the arts, the professions, and public life provided those projects are informed by and significantly contribute to humanities scholarship. • 9-month term (September – May). Fall term (September – December) and Spring term (January – May) are also available. • Must have a doctorate or equivalent scholarly credentials. • Mid-career, senior scholars, and emerging scholars with a strong record of peer-reviewed work are encouraged to apply.

Stanford Humanities Center	External Faculty Fellowship	Up to \$70,000, plus up to \$40,000 for housing and moving allowance	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support research in the traditional and emergent disciplines of the humanities and the interpretive social sciences. • 9-month term (mid-September – mid-June). • Must live within a ten-mile radius of Stanford University during the fellowship term. • Must have a Ph.D. and be at least 3 years beyond receipt of the degree at the start of the fellowship year. • Former external faculty fellows are not eligible. • No citizenship requirements.
Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars	Wilson Center Fellowship	\$90,000	October	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Topics and scholarship should relate to key public policy challenges. • 9-month term. • Must have a doctorate, JD, or equivalent. • Former fellows should wait at least 5 years before applying again and must apply with a new project. • No citizenship requirements. • Must be at the Center during the fellowship term.
American Association of University Women (AAUW)	American Fellowships	\$8,000 - \$50,000	November	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support women scholars who are pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conducting postdoctoral research full-time, or preparing research for publication. • Eight-week term. • Must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. • Open to women, including people who identify as women, in all fields of study at an accredited institution of higher education.
Harry Ransom Center, UT Austin	Research Fellowships	\$2,000 or \$3,500/month according to the category of award and the fellows' need to travel to the Center, plus \$500 to individuals who are a citizen or resident of a country other than the U.S. for J-1 visa and/or international travel to Austin	November	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support research in all areas of the humanities including literature, photography, film, art, performing arts, music, cultural history, and interdisciplinary studies. • Projects must require substantial on-site use of the Center's collections. • June 1 – August 31. The start date can be flexible if all the administrative documentation has been submitted before the outset of the residency period.

The Newberry Library	Long-Term Fellowships	\$5,000/month	November	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support research projects that utilize the Newberry's collection to advance scholarship in the humanities. • 4- to 9-month term starting September. • Must be in residence. • Must have a Ph.D. or equivalent terminal degree. • Must be U.S. citizens or foreign nationals who have been in the U.S. for 3 years before applying.
Department of Defense, Office of Naval Research	Summer Faculty Research Program	\$1,650/week, \$1,900/week, or \$2,150/week depending on the levels of the appointment, plus \$3,500 if relocating greater than 50 miles from home location	December	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 levels of appointment: Summer Faculty Fellow, Senior Summer Faculty Fellow, and Distinguished Summer Faculty Fellow. • 10-week term during May, June, July, and August. • Must be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident and hold a teaching or research position at a U.S. college or university. No Dual Citizens.
National Academies	Ford Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowships	\$50,000	December	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Awarded for full-time research at appropriate nonprofit institutions of higher education or research, normally in the U.S., including universities, museums, libraries, government or national laboratories, privately sponsored nonprofit institutes, government-chartered nonprofit research organizations, and centers for advanced study. • 1 year term. Starting June 1 (for 12 months) or September 1 (for 9 or 12 months). • Must be U.S. citizen or national, permanent resident, have DACA status, Temporary Protected Status, asylee, refugee, or indigenous individual exercising rights associated with the Jay Treaty of 1794.
